Day 1



Lisbon sprawls along the banks of the Tagus River estuary. Its name comes from the Phoenician meaning "enchanting port." From the city's hills, you can look toward the River and the Atlantic where the Portuguese inaugurated the Age of Discovery, which lead them to the New World and many important ports in the East. The low-lying areas of the city were rebuilt after the destructive Great Earthquake of 1755, but in recent times, Lisbon has come to life with newfound trendy energy. Travel writers are running out of superlatives to describe this once-sleepy capital on the Atlantic coast, where history and tradition coalesce with contemporary chic and style.





Palácio Ludovice, Wine Experience Hotel, is a 5 star hotel located in the heart of Lisbon, a few steps from the emblematic Glória Tram, surrounded by Chiado, Bairro Alto, and Príncipe Real neighborhoods, and facing the breathtaking panoramic views from the São Pedro de Alcântara belvedere. The palace is the former private residence of João Federico Ludovice, architect to King João V in the 18th century, and responsible for several important structures in Portugal, such as the Mafra National Palace, Lisbon's Aqueduct, and the church and its famous tower, in Coimbra's University.

Day 2



Embark on a soothing cruise and capture Lisbon in its splendor, just as great explorers did for centuries. A friendly crew welcomes you aboard, and if the wind is up, the sails will soon be opened. Sit back and relax as you catch the early sunset. It's a wonderful feeling to get out on the water and enjoy the sea breeze and the spectacular views of Lisbon.



This morning meet your private driver and your local guide at the lobby reception and together you'll embark on a half-day tour starting at the bustling heart of Lisbon including the district of Belem.

Head to the Alfama district, the former Jewish Quarter and unmistakable soul of the capital city adorned with steep winding alleys, hidden landmark churches, echoes of tunes of fado music and stunning views of the Tagus River.

Beyond the former Jewish quarters, there are stories in artifacts festooned around the city that enable an understanding of the Early Modern Diaspora, The Passover Massacre, Crypto-Jewish practices and famous Jewish families associated with Portugal.



The capital of Portugal is one of the most charismatic and vibrant cities in Europe, it effortlessly blends traditional heritage and striking modernism. It offers a rich and varied history and is blessed with a glorious year-round climate.



Made up of various constructions built over successive eras, Sintra it is one of the most important Portuguese examples of royal architecture and has therefore been classified as a national monument. This palace is thought to have been originally a palace of the Moorish walls and has the greatest collection of Mudéjar tiles in the country. It is topped by two large twin chimneys built over the kitchen, which have become the symbol of Sintra. Enjoy some free time in the cozy town center and explore the typical shops and ateliers, where you can buy handicrafts and taste the local delicacies.

Day 5



Coimbra is a quaint town offering winding cobblestone alleys, commercial plazas, and hilltop views overlooking the Rio Mondego. A center of learning, par excellence, the University of Coimbra was founded in 1290 and is one of the oldest in Europe, and was classified World Heritage site by UNESCO. The group of buildings that make up the oldest university in the country are internationally famous, and the jewel in the crown is the Joanina Library.

After your tour, you might like to pay a visit to the Botanic Gradens before continuing on with your driver to your hotel in the Douro Valley.



3 Nights

Six Senses Douro Valley's UNESCO World Heritage setting fronts onto the River Douro as it winds through the world's oldest demarcated wine region. 







Set off from Pinhão, the heart of the Douro Valley, and unwind as you cycle alongside the many vineyards in this spectacular wine region. An unforgettable and adventurous way to take in the scenery and remarkable views. Enjoy lunch at a local wine estate and indulge in Portuguese cuisine followed by a wine tasting experience where you'll try the finest local wines. In the afternoon, take a stroll around the village of Pinhão before being transferred back to your hotel.



The River Douro rises in Spain and flows more or less East / West across Northern Portugal reaching the sea at Portugal's second city, Porto. Once a fast-flowing river of rapids and narrow ravines, it has been tamed over the past 25 years by the construction of 8 dams along its length giving it, in most places, a tranquil, lake-like appearance. The valley is spectacularly beautiful with the hills falling steeply down to the water 's edge becoming more and more sparsely populated and wild the further inland one travels, with more of the land being given over to terraces of vines and, to a lesser extent, olive groves.



Start by visiting a small olive-oil mill before heading down through a local vineyard, where only a few are allowed. Through our local contacts, you'll have insider access, walking through the vineyard where other tourists are not allowed to go. As you make your way down the valley, you'll learn about what makes this wine region so unique.



The Six Senses Hotel offers an array of activities, perfect for a relaxed and leisurely day. Enjoy a yoga class, lessons with a wine somellier, play pool in their chic bar area, stroll their gardens and vineyard, or just sit back, relax and take in their views.

Destined to be your five-star second home, Le Monumental Palace is based upon the elegant French art of living. Situated in the heart of the city, Le Monumental, built in 1923 in a Neoclassical style, connects Porto's past to its future. Only a stone's throw away from Clérigos, Bolhao market, and Dom Luís I Bridge, the hotel features white marble from Estremoz, black ironwork, and high ceilings with a luminosity that will take your breath away. The hotel's Art Deco lobby staircase sets the tone and pace for this lively, trendsetting and fine dining establishment. Here, food is a bastion of French gastronomic excellence with three different locations placed under the high command of a French Michelin-starred chef. It's a monumental adventure to be experienced at the mouth of the Douro River, with your heart facing the ocean and your eyes gazing out across one of Europe's most stunning destinations.

With your private guide, visit some of the city's key historic sites: the Romanesque cathedral, which dates back to the 12th century; former stock exchange, the Palácio da Bolsa; and the beautiful São Bento railway station, whose walls tell the history of Portugal through more than 20,000 tiles.

Explore the neighborhood of Praça da Ribeira with its winding, cobbled streets; walk down Porto's main thoroughfare, the architecturally impressive Avenida dos Aliados; call in at São Francisco church, a fine example of Baroque ornamentation; and visit the historic Livraria Lello bookstore.

Posada Terra Santa is a magnificent 16th century mansion once owned by Spanish aristocrats, now been transformed into a stylish, cozy, four-star boutique hotel hidden away in Palma's historic quarter. Vibrant Plaça Major and the Capital's shops, bars and restaurants are only a five-minute stroll away.




