Today you'll learn about the history and culture of Kyoto, the center of Japanese civilation for about one thousand years.



Silver Pavilion (Ginkakuji)

In its understated elegance, Ginkaku-ji embodies the Japanese aesthetic of wabi-sabi—the art of finding beauty in imperfection.

Philosopher's Path

The Philosopher's Path is a pleasant stone path through the northern part of Kyoto's Higashiyama district. The path follows a canal which is lined by hundreds of cherry trees. During *hanami*, the cherry blossom season, these trees explode with color, making this one of the city's most popular *hanami*.



Private Visit to Tsuki No Katsura Sake Brewery

Since it is bottled during the fermenting stage, Nigori-sake is effervescent and is known as the "sake sparkling". Tsukino Katsura also preserves probably the oldest aged sake in Japan, Koshu, dating back 50 years.

Day 12



Discover the charm of wagashi while learning to create your own with one of Kyoto's traditional wagashi shops. Through this experience, you will gain a deeper understanding of the fundamental aspect of Japanese aesthetics as well as the Japanese craftsmanship mentality, monozukuri no seishin.



Inside the grounds of Tenryu-ji Temple, Shigetsu is a great place to try traditional Japanese Buddhist cuisines, also known as shojin-ryori.





An easy and enjoyable way to see Arashiyama is to hop on a rickshaw.



Visit Arashiyama (monkey park, bamboo forest)

Go to the west edge of the city to visit scenic Arashiyama, where Kyoto's aristocracy traditionally went to relax and enjoy nature. The Hozugawa River runs through high gorge cliffs and beautiful greenery, and passes under a famous bridge. Make a short but steep climb to the monkey park, and share a photo from Arashiyama's famed bamboo forest. You can ride down the river in a boat steered by master handlers, and/or ride a small locomotive through the area's woodlands.
