Then, view the Great Sphinx backdropped by the pyramids, a setting that has captured the imaginations of adventurers for centuries.



Flanking the Nile, Luxor is divided by the river, its modern city on the east bank and the ancient necropolis on the west. Formerly known as Thebes, this was once the mighty capital of ancient Egypt. Today, Luxor endures as an open-air museum of grand monuments, including the temples of Karnak, the Great Hypostyle Hall and the Valley of the Kings. Luxor invites guests to explore its embarrassment of archeological riches, a historic treasure trove set against the dramatic backdrop of the Theban escarpment.

Day 4



Upon arrival in Luxor, visit two of Egypt's finest temples, the Temples of Luxor and Karnak. The Temple of Luxor is situated right in the heart of the city, which was once Thebes, the capital of ancient Egypt at its most powerful. Much of the temple was built by Amenhotep III (1405 1367 BC). But overshadowing everything is the northern section of the temple built by Ramses II which contains his likeness in a colossal statue. The Karnak Temple, the Seat of Amun, the Imperial god, is focused upon the awesome Hypostyle Hall. Covering 50,000 square feet, there are 134 great columns that once supported an enormous roof, an extraordinary engineering feat for the 12th century BC. There are also superb statues of Ramses II and Tutankhamen, in addition to the fine Obelisks of Queen Hatshepsut and Tuthmosis I.

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Upon arrival in Cairo International, transfer by private vehicle to your hotel to drop your luggage before heading out to the world-famous Egyptian Museum of Antiquities. The museum, which houses over 120,000 relics including some dating back to 4000 BC, gives you an introduction to the different periods of ancient Egypt and the individual artistic and architectural styles of these periods. Among the many relics, you may see the beautiful statue of Tuthmosis III and the

extraordinary statue of Akhenaten with its strangely deformed head that contrasts the great beauty of his favorite queen Nefertiti.

Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant accompanied by your Egyptologist, and then switch your concentration to a different period of Cairo's history, dating from AD 640 when the Caliph Amr conquered the Roman fortress. Finally, embark on an enjoyable walking tour from Bab El Fotouh to the ancient thoroughfare of the Khan El-Khalili, the area that was once the heart of the old walled city of Cairo and where today, stalls display spices, leather goods, and jewelry.

Day 5





1 Night

Duration

Day 6



This morning after breakfast, embark on a half day excursion to explore the West Bank, the 'Necropolis of Thebes,' beginning with a visit to the famous Valley of the Kings - the burial ground of the Pharaohs of the New Kingdom when ancient Egypt was at its most powerful. Over sixty tombs have been discovered here to date, including that of 'the boy king,' Tutankhamun. Enter the tomb of Tutankhamun - found in 1922 by British archaeologist and Egyptologist Howard Carter - to discover for yourself the secrets of this storied chamber. Also, descend into the tomb of Seti I, the father of Ramses II, one of the best-preserved tombs in the Valley of the Kings.

From here, you visit the lovely, terraced funerary temple of Queen Hatshepsut - Egypt's first female pharaoh. You then pause for a photo stop at the fabled Colossi of Memnon, two enormous, seated statues of Amenhotep III, known in Ancient Greek times for their haunting voices at dawn.

Proceed to the Valley of the Queens (Biban el-Harim) to see the Tomb of Nefertari, wife of Ramses II, which is different in style from the other queens' tombs unearthed to date. Its magnificent painted stucco reliefs, exhibiting the utmost delicacy of execution and including particularly fine figures of the queen herself, have unfortunately been damaged by water seepage.

At the conclusion of your sightseeing, transfer to the Nile River, where you board a felucca, a traditional Egyptian sailing vessel, and you enjoy lunch as you sail along on this ancient river.



To see the rose-red city of Petra in the daylight is an awe-inspiring experience, but to see it at night lit up by 1,800 flickering candles is truly magical. The special aura of the ancient Nabatean trading empire comes to life as you stroll through the mysterious Siq and arrive at the stunning al Khazneh (The Treasury) with music and stories to help you experience Petra as the travel-weary traders of old must have known it.





Spend a full day exploring the 'Rose-Red City' of Petra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site sculpted from a mountain range by the Nabataeans in the third century BC. Visit the Temple of Winged Lions - a large, sacred complex featuring an ascending staircase; a grand, column-flanked entrance; and an inner cultic chamber with a raised podium. See, too, the ruins of the Corinthian Tomb, noting the Hellenistic details on its upper level and the Nabataean portico on its lower level. At the Palace Tomb, observe the decorated columns, pillars and four gates, the latter leading to burial rooms. Continue on to the Treasury, baths, markets and storerooms.

Day 8



Depart Petra and drive to the spectacular desert of Wadi Rum, an otherworldly landscape of dramatic sandstone mountains, natural arches, and rocky caverns and steep chasms lined with prehistoric inscriptions and carvings. On arrival, join a local Bedouin family for lunch. Exchange stories and hear about life in Jordan, firsthand, during this intimate experience. Afterwards, explore the rose-tinted mountains and marvelous desert vistas where T.E. Lawrence (Lawrence of Arabia) lived with his Bedouin friends and allies during World War I. Bedouin camps are evident in the wadi, which is still home to a number of Bedouin families. Traverse Wadi Rum by Bedouin four-wheel-drive vehicle and camel to take in the unforgettable landscape. Arrive at your tented camp and admire your surroundings, almost supernatural atmosphere with its immense size, color and awe-inspiring shapes.



1 Night

Situated in the heart of Wadi Rum, Discovery Bedu Camp looks out to striking red dunes, rugged cliffs and wide-open skies. This permeant tented camp offers six canvas pavilions, each with its own deck, king-sized bed, star bed and en suite bathroom.
