

## Day 2





You will meet your guide at the hotel lobby and walk to the hotel pier to embark on a private motor yacht to enjoy a sunset cruise on the Bosphorus, the narrow strait of water separating the Asian and European continents and the life blood of Istanbul. Passing along the shores of the Bosphorus you will view magnificent palaces, restored Ottoman villas, impressive fortresses and the waterside residences of Istanbul's elite.

## Day 3



You will meet your professional guide in the hotel lobby for your private half-day of sightseeing:

Hagia Sophia is mostly known as one of the most valuable and fascinating structures in the world of art and architecture. It deserves to enter to the collection of the rare works by challenging to the time. The walls of this beautiful piece of architecture are decorated with gorgeous mosaics. UNESCO accepts Hagia Sophia as The World Heritage because of architectural beauty. Blue Mosque, this breath-taking building is one of the most majestic Ottoman mosques in all of Turkey. The blue Iznik Tiles covering the walls have given the mosque its popular name, Blue Mosque. Make sure you will spend some time in silence inside the magnificent mosque to admire its prayerful atmosphere and superb blue tiles.


You will visit the **Hippodrome Square** which was built by Septimius Severus to entertain the public at the beginning of A.D 2 th century, In 196. Pretty attractive Thedosius I Obelisk is the product of Egypt. This alone should give you some idea of how impressive the Hippodrome of Constantinople's architecture was.

The Serefiye Cistern, believed to have been built under the reign of Byzantine emperor Theodosius II (42843), was uncovered under an early 20th century mansion and a municipal building that was constructed in 1950. It was known as Theodosius Cistern in the past, but it is called Serefiye, meaning the "Goodwill" in Turkish, since 19th century.

Lined with frescoes, paintings and ceilings covered with mythological figures, the club features city views with typical Soho House style modern and vintage furniture, club spaces as well as areas and rooftop pools.

## Day 5




You will meet your professional guide at the hotel lobby for your private full-day of sightseeing.

The historical **Egyptian / Spice Bazaar** is a colorful and mystical covered spice market lined with spice stalls in Eminonu coast, near the Yeni Mosque, in the Historical Peninsula of Istanbul. Spices, dried fruits, cheeses, sausages, jams, nuts and seeds, Turkish delight and other edibles fill most of the shops. You are able to find about every kind of herbs and spices at the market, and as well as ingredients for cooking, Turkish delight and Turkish coffee.

You will visit the magnificent **Topkapi Palace** which was completed between 1465 and 1478. The Topkap Palace Museum is notable not only for its architecture and collections but also for the history and culture of the Ottoman Empire that it recalls. Opulent, decadent and steeped in history, it offers visitors a chance to get to know the Sultans of the Ottoman Empire rather more intimately.

You will visit the **Grand Bazaar**. Before arrival to the Grand Bazaar you will have an opportunity to learn about the art of carpet weaving. One of the oldest and largest covered markets in the world, the Grand Bazaar dates from the 15th century. The world famous handmade carpets and kilims of Turkey, some of the most beautiful examples of Turkish silver art, souvenirs and decorations made of copper and bronze and high quality ceramics, onyx, and leather goods are for sale.
